This is one of my favorite quotes by Jeffrey R. Holland:

"Jesus has chosen, even in a resurrected, otherwise perfected body, to retain for the benefit of His disciples the wounds in His hands and in His feet and in His side-signs, if you will, that painful things happen even to the pure and the perfect; signs, if you will, that pain in this world is not evidence that God doesn't love you; signs, if you will, that problems pass and happiness can be ours."

In the book "The Power of Everyday Missionaries" Clayton Christensen talks about how he studied the D&C to find the benefits to doing missionary work and how to balance it with all the other callings and stresses on daily life that we have. He found so many blessings and realized that really when you do the Lord's work in that area, so many other aspects of our lives will be taken care of and the blessings of doing it are amazing. He listed out many scriptures and categorized them like this:

Power and Strength

None shall stay you (1:5).

You shall receive strength such as is not known among men (24:12).

He Himself will go with you and be in your midst. Nothing shall prevail against you (32:3).

Power shall rest upon you. He will be with you and go before your face (39:12).

Your enemies will not have power over you (44:5).

The Lord will stand by you (68:6).

No weapon formed against you shall prosper (71:9).

He will uphold you (93:51).

The gates of hell shall not prevail against you (17:8).

You shall have power to declare His word (99:2).

Your tongue shall be loosed, and you will have the power of God unto the convincing of men (11:21).

Your mouth shall be filled and you shall become even as Nephi of old (33:8).

You will not be confounded. It shall be given you in the very hour that portion that shall be meted unto every man (84:85, 100:5).

Your words shall be scripture, shall be the will of the Lord, shall be the mind of the Lord, and shall be the voice of the Lord and the power of God unto salvation (68:4).

Your arm will be God's arm. He will be your shield and buckler; He will gird up your loins and put your enemies under your feet (35:14).

Personal Purity and Increased Faith

You shall stand blameless before God (4:2).

You shall be lifted up at the last day (17:8).

You will be given a testimony of the words of the prophets (21:9).

You shall have revelations (28:8).

Your sins will be forgiven (31:5, 36:1, 60:7, 62:3, 84:61).

You shall have great faith (39:12).

You will be able to keep God's laws (44:5).

Happiness, Health and Prosperity

You shall have blessings greater than the treasures of earth (19:37-38).

He will take care of your flocks (88:72).

Your back shall be laden with sheaves (31:5, 33:9).

You shall not be weary in mind, body, limb or joint, and you shall not go hungry or thirsty. A hair from your head shall not fall to the ground unnoticed (84:80, 116).

Your joy shall be great (18:14-15).

Holy Ghost

He will send upon you the Comforter, which shall teach you the truth and the way wither you shall go (79:2).

The Holy Ghost shall be shed forth in bearing record of all things, whatsoever ye shall say (100:8).

He will go before your face. He will be on your right hand and on your left: His Spirit shall be in your hearts, and His angels round about you, to bear you up (84:88).

He will bear you up as on eagles' wings; and you shall beget glory and honor to yourself and unto the Lord's name (124:18).

He will make you holy (60:7).

Then he goes on to say: "Sharing the gospel doesn't just *require* that we have the power of God unto the convincing of men. It *gives* us this power... Missionary work will help those of us who are battling against addictions and bad habits and are struggling to feel worthy, to stand blameless before God, to become forgiven of our sins, and to have the strength to keep God's laws. It doesn't just demand our purity. It will *help* us be pure. For those of us who struggle with sadness, sharing the gospel will give us great joy. It will make us become holy men and women who have great revelations and are borne up from our burdens as on eagles' wings, begetting glory and honor to ourselves and unto the Lord's name."

I think that is very powerful! I thought you could share that with Brandon, and I know that some of the blessings are some you are seeking and I am seeking too. I want so bad to share the gospel, but I have had the hardest time. I am praying daily for opportunities and especially for the strength to open my mouth. But I know the Lord delivers on His promises and these are promises, so I am going to try harder!

Hi my wonderful son!!!

So I got to see where you were all day yesterday! Brother Hansen sent a text with your picture and all it said was, "Conference breakfast." It came through as just a number and I thought maybe it was your cell phone. I looked at the picture and recognized the Hansen's home in the background and texted, "It looks like the Hansen's home!" :D Dad told me later it WAS the Hansen's and Brother Hansen had sent the text. So I sent another text explaining the silly text from earlier and then felt pleased that I HAD recognized their home, and of course the plate you held was a perfect above and beyond breakfast to celebrate Conference in a very Sister Hansen style.:) So at least I got the people right, huh? And then your dinner looked like another feast! Yesterday must have been a really wonderful day to soak in the messages of conference and enjoy it with wonderful members and several investigators!! You really are having an incredible mission, my son!!!

Last week was packed full! I brought a basket of goodies to the staff at Envita with a thank you card that I had wanted to send all last month, but I had ordered a plaque with a quote of Proverbs 3:5-6 on it: Trust in the Lord with all thine heart, etc. and it came just a couple of days before I came back. So I took it in myself. One of the goodies was a Texas-shaped box with the pecan roca I like to buy at Christmas time. Of course they LOVED it!!! After immunotherapy, I went and got a scan. The nurse put an IV in one arm and it "blew" as she put it, so she had to do the other arm. Both hurt. :(Oh well. I got the scan and then I drove down to see Spencer. He showed me his apartment and then we went to a restaurant and he drove me around a bit.

On Tuesday I got my blood drawn from my arm for tests and the phlebotomist took one vile of blood and then took out the needle. I asked if that was all because I thought there were several tests they were doing. She looked at her paper and realized she didn't get enough. So she had to poke me again. Luckily she didn't hurt me very much on either pokes. After immunotherapy I went back to the apartment and my cousin, Mischelle came over about 2:00 and we had a great time talking and strengthening each other. She left about 10:30 PM. Then I called Spencer and I think we talked till 12:30.

Wednesday was immunotherapy again and then an appointment with Dr. Grado, my radiation oncologist who went over the results of the scan. I didn't ask very good questions so it wasn't very informative. He did tell me that there are calcium deposits in the tumors which is a very good sign. It means the calcium is starting to wall off the tumors and that will prevent the tumors from receiving nutrients. But the radiologist report from the imaging place had given a comparison of that scan to the previous pet scan I got in December. I had gotten a couple of CT scans at Dr. Grado's in January and February and so I wanted a comparison of those by Dr. Grado, but he didn't. So My Dr. at Envita is trying to get that information. (did that make any sense?:))

After that appointment, I met Sister "BOWman" (as she says you pronounce it:)) at Kneaders and we ate and talked and just barely made the 7:30 session. It was really great! Got home late that night again!

Tursday I got the blood test results back and met with Dr. Oertle (pronounced Ertlee) and because the tumor marker went from 12 to 15 he wanted me to stay an extra week. So I was pretty bummed and so was Dad. After immuno, I met Spencer after his work and he wanted to put a package together for you. So we headed to Chandler and found a Target and had fun shopping. After dropping it off, we went and got food and I took him home. Because I was a little bummed out about the blood results and of course his situation isn't what I want, I got pretty sad. I was crying in the car as I left and decided to call him. I couldn't tell him my feelings about his spiritual stuff, but I apologized for my less than enthusiastic goodbye and told him I was sad because of the blood test and was worried about him. So he tried to comfort me. He suggested we get together the next night and go see Captain America. So I said ok.

Friday after immuno, I relaxed a bit at the apartment and then met Spencer in Tempe around 8:30. We went to the movie. Really good, but lots of killing. (Surprise!) Afterward we talked for a while about the solar stuff and I asked a lot of questions. He really enjoyed talking. But it was 12:30 and I was getting tired. I asked what he was doing Sunday and he asked why. I invited him to watch General Conference with me. He declined so I was bummed out again.

Anyway, Conference was so good and by the end of the Sunday morning session I was feeling filled with the words of the Lord and all that sort of thing.:) I spent a lot of time on the phone with Dad, Emily, Damon and Grandma Scott. It was nice after a very busy week to just stay in the apartment and enjoy the outpouring of revelation! I even went and got a nice cross stitch pattern to do while I'm at Envita, so I got out a couple of times on Saturday, also getting food for the week. And on Sunday I took a walk around the apartment complex in bare feet enjoying the beauty and quiet and soft grass.:)

Sister BOWman texted me this morning and she and Sister Baer and I are going to go the the temple this week together! I'm looking forward to it! The blessings of the gospel are so beautiful! As Elder Holland says, though, they come at a cost. But it's soooo worth it! I loved Elder Corbridge's talk about Joseph Smith and the things he accomplished and his beautiful and powerful witness of him and the Savior! I also loved Elder Christofferson's powerful testimony of the reality of the resurrection and the blessings that come because of it! He gave a witness of the Savior that I felt he has a sure knowledge of the Lord, a literal eye-witness. Also President Packer. At the end of both their talks, their language is clear in that way. And I loved how Elder Holland bore such a powerful testimony of the priesthood! It all strengthened my faith! Do you remember the talk by Elder Corbridge a few years ago where he said, "He is the way. Any other way, whatever other way is foolishness."? I loved that talk! I know you miss who you left, but there are great experiences ahead that will help you grow and also where you will be able to help so many others grow too! People follow leaders who have titles to a certain level, but they zealously follow leaders who have moral authority. Moral authority comes from having Christlike attributes. That's why Ghandi had a whole nation follow him even though he never even held a government office or title. George Washington held a title in the war, and the men followed, but he was revered because of his character, not his title. And of course, Jesus is the ultimate example as always! I know you are striving to become like him more and more and those desires and qualities will powerfully influence your zone, your investigators, and your companion! I guess it's companions! :) I just went to your Facebook page and saw them! I haven't been on FB for a week or more, so there were a lot of posts I hadn't read. I'm upping the veggie intake and I'm sure there will be some good results coming! Also, your prayers will have a huge effect! Thank you! Thank you!! I know this cancer is going away, it's just a matter of time. I just want to boost the time up!!!

Last Wednesday I met Sister Bowman and Sister Baer at the Gilbert Temple for the 4:00 session. We whispered in the Celestial Room for 3 hours and then probably another hour in the dressing room! It was a wonderful time! Truly kindred spirits! Friends I wouldn't have met without your mission. Missions are the best!:) I felt glad that I could stay an extra week because I was able to go to the temple, see Spencer again, and meet a few people at Envita I hadn't met before and give them love and encouragement. It's amazing how many people I have met through this experience!

Last Thursday Spencer picked me up and we went to the Mesa Easter pageant. It was good. I think Spencer was a little stir crazy, but we enjoyed our visit with each other.

The Lord is pushing me to levels of trust and faith that I never thought I'd be pushed to. I am feeling slightly what trusting with ALL my heart actually feels like and means. It comes in waves, not a steady flow, but it is stronger now. Hi Taylor!

I am SO glad you are loving your new area and new assignment! You are totally capable and the Lord will magnify your efforts and the work will roll forward and powerfully!! What an amazing experience you had as you were there to give a message of hope to that man at a time when he was experiencing such grief over his daughter. I know you were there at that time for the Lord's purposes in blessing his life. It is such a privilege to be an instrument in His hands, because it fills you with a portion of the love He has for others and also for you!

This week has been a challenge. Dad has been on the research warpath trying to find more ways to help me get better. I came home deciding to juice and look into more detox protocols, and Dad felt the same thing while he was in the temple. So we are looking at going out to Mexico (Tijuana) at the end of May for three weeks to do a therapy that involves a lot of organic juicing and coffee enemas. It is highly effective at curing advanced cancer. At this place they teach you how to do it and also have some other immunotherapies. Then you go home and continue on your own for TWO YEARS. I know it is the thing I need to get this completely gone. I wasn't prepared to do this last September, but I am totally ready now. It is a full time job, as it requires me to make and drink a juice every waking hour and doing an enema every two hours. The coffee is made of organic green coffee beans only slightly

roasted. It isn't like the coffee you drink. It is also not taken orally. When it is put in, it absorbs into the liver and increases the effectiveness of its cleansing abilities 700%! The therapy also lets you eat 3 meals a day, but it is a very strict diet of only certain foods, mostly of vegetables and fruits, with a bowl of oatmeal and rye toast for breakfast, a vegetable soup and salad, cooked vegetable, and baked potato for lunch and dinner. Fresh fruit as snacks throughout the day. Dad and Emily will come too and they are both planning on doing a modified protocol. It doesn't have to be as intense as mine, but they are hoping to have really good results too.

I will probably still come out to Envita to get immunotherapy once a month after the trip to Mexico. We will see. I know it will be hard to do because it is so much work, but I will be feeling good the whole time. That's so much better than getting dumped with toxins and losing my hair and being in a wheelchair, etc. I'm so grateful Dad is on board with this way and isn't fighting me on it. He is encouraging me and reading tons about it.

I was wishy washy all week about doing Passover. It was going to be so much work and stress and so many people involved, that I wasn't sure I could pull it off. But by Thursday or Friday morning, I finally decided to go for it and invite everyone I was going to and just see how it fell. I couldn't drop the feeling to do it. So when I invited everyone, they all ended up saying yes!

This is who came: Me, Dad, Emily, Brandon, Mindy, Daenon, Kylee, Ryan, Eden and Alex. Then the two sister missionaries. Then a lady (Lisa) in Nottingham Country ward who is a Jewish convert and her husband who is a Christian convert, and their 6 year old and 1 year old boys. Then the Jewish lady (Rory) the sister missionaries are helping and her non active Mormon husband and their 6 year old and one year old daughters. That's 20 people if you didn't count already!:) We brought in chairs to form a big circle in the family room to do the Seder, to make it more cozy and like a FHE. I went online and found a few coloring pages on the Church's website of Abraham, Sarah, Isaac, Jacob, 12 sons, Joseph, and Moses. I colored them and cut them out and put flannel on the back. Then I made little flannel boards for the 2 6 year olds to hold during the story part. I also found on google a set of printable finger puppets depicting the 10 plagues and assembled them with Emily the day before, to keep the children occupied and engaged. It worked a little. They were pretty wild kids!:) NOTHING like you wonderful, well-behaved children!:)

I was still sweating and it was squishy, but the whole thing pulled off great and I think everyone had a good time. LIsa shared her conversion with Rory. Before we started the Seder, I thought we should go around and introduce ourselves to everyone. When Lisa went, she choked up and said how excited she was to be doing a Seder, because she had not celebrated Passover for 14 years. I had Lisa and Rory recite the Mother prayer over the candles. We found the Hebrew transcribed for those prayers and they both recited them. It was really cool to hear it in Hebrew. I think they appreciated it! Lisa brought Matza Ball soup and Rory made Kasha for a side dish which I think really pleased her, especially since

everyone liked it. The sisters came home from church with us and helped me make the roasted red potatoes and keep my nerves calm. They really enjoyed participating in the whole thing too.

I hope you had a wonderful Easter! I am so grateful for the Savior. My suffering, both emotionally (because of Heather and Spencer's choices over the past few years), and my physical suffering, which hasn't been that great, but the seriousness of the illness is, has really increased my level of appreciation for the Savior and what He willingly suffered. I think in your blog post you mentioned something about how He never doubted the Father's love and endured the Garden, trial, crucifixion, and more suffering on the cross. The way you said it (and I can't reference it right now because I am on the plane flying to Arizona right now:)) struck something in me. I could relate to what you said. It was like I realized that sometimes I either have weak moments of doubt in Heavenly Father's love or maybe wonder at the level of trials I am going through. And I think it's not fair, or when is it going to end, or I've been a good girl, I have, so why all of this? And I know it's weak and I have a talk with myself and with Heavenly Father and plead for strength to endure as I come to submit to His will. But the Savior, who didn't deserve any of what he suffered, willingly did it and never wavered in his knowledge of the purpose and of His Father's reality and constant attention and love. That thought is powerful and I will try to remember that in my weak moments! But it did give me more appreciation on Easter for the glorious acts our beloved Savior did for us, and for His infinite generosity and selfless service!!!! There are so few words that even come close to expressing the majesty of His love, power and gift of eternal life, that I feel I can't praise Him adequately.

I am so happy in the deepest part of my soul that you are where you are doing what you are doing and feeling what you are feeling as you teach and preach and heal and bless and love and serve!!! You are such an example to so many!!! Keep up the great work!!! I saw Sister Short yesterday and she said Corbin is getting his papers going for his mission. I'm excited for him! He's so young though!!!:)

The Easter Devotional sounds like a great event and I'm sure you did a great job! If I had been watching the whole thing and knowing the details you did, I would probably have been stressed for you, but what a wonderful way it all turned out!:)

So you are back to a two-some companionship. I'm sure you had an awesome time with Elder Karl for the brief time you were able to spend with him! He sounds like a great example of how to end his mission with as much energy as he came in with! Have you been getting Chad's emails? He sounds the same, working hard and trying to get everyone in Germany converted the last few weeks of his mission, or Austria, or wherever he is serving!:) Do you get Brian's emails too?

Well, life just keeps getting more and more adventurous! Dad gave you some details of what we're doing in his email, but if you haven't read it, I'll summarize. We are going to Mexico on Wed (like in 2 days!) for 3 weeks. This place had an opening and we decided we should go sooner than later. I think in my last email I told you all about the therapy. I will have more to tell next week, so it's still all the info I know. Dad and Emily are so supportive and positive. I'm so blessed! We are all actually looking forward to it, it will be kind of vacation-like. It is in Tijuana, Mexico, right across the border of San Diego, CA. We went there with Roark's family once to that waterpark. Do you remember? It's the family video where Heather does the Macarena and turns and her pants have dirt on them. :D

The treatments besides the juicing and food may not be as vacation-like for me, what with doing 5 enemas (with my colostomy) each day, and a couple of therapies that build up a huge army of cells that detect mutated cells and one therapy that is kind of like how they do immunizations by putting in dead something or other things and then the body reacts by spiking a fever, but then goes on the attack in hyperdrive and attack the tumors. And I hear I will feel the attack in my liver. Sounds like a blast, huh? :) BRING IT ON!!!

So on Friday after treatment, I went up to a resort in North Scottsdale to see Sister Bowman. We talked and walked and so enjoyed the conversation, friendship and the beauty and peace of the place. We are going there as a family in a couple of years, just sayin!!! I LOVE that place!!! Then Dad and Brother Bowman came up and we had dinner with them. We talked like we had been long-time friends. They are really wonderful people! About 10:30 that night we got back to the apartment and Spencer came over. Dad was too exhausted for more than 10 minutes of conversation, but I talked with him till about 12:45. :) I feel bad we didn't spend more time with him though.

So in Sunday school we were talking about the children of Israel wandering in the wilderness and eating manna for 40 years and how they complained and wanted something different. Jen Hansen made a comment about how we need to receive what the Lord gives us. He gives us what we need and it may not be exactly what we think we want, but if we look at it like, He gave it to us for our learning and benefit, we need to learn t receive it with gratitude. It reminded me of Elder Wirthlin's talk titled Come What May and Love it. I think it was the way she said it that opened my heart and softened it to accept with gratitude and joy what I have been given, the good the bad and the everything! Like you said in a previous letter, quoting President Uchdorf "be grateful IN all our circumstances, rather than being grateful FOR our

Dear Family,

As some of you know and some of you don't know, I thought I would send an email out to everyone telling you about our latest adventure we are embarking on. I had been able to go home for the month of March and it was very wonderful to see friends and be in my home and just feel normal. When I went back to Arizona for a "maintanance" week of immunotherapy, I got a blood test and my tumor marker had gone up, rather than down, which was our expectation and hope. So I stayed another week and got another blood test. And it went up again. So I came home for a week to regroup and both Damon and I felt that I should increase the nutrition and detoxification to my protocol.

As we researched, the Gerson Therapy kept coming up. The therapy is essentially a very strict diet of 13 glasses of vegetable juices per day (1 per hour) and three meals of cooked vegetables, salads, potatoes, oatmeal, and fresh organic fruit. That's the nutrition part. The detox part is 3 coffee enemas per day. The liquid is absorbed into the liver and helps the enzymes in the liver that cleanse by 700%.

We found a place in Mexico that administers the Gerson Therapy along with some advanced therapies, some of which are not available in the US. So after study, and prayer, we decided to go. Damon, Emily and I arrived Wednesday afternoon (4/30) and it is interesting so far! We are situated south of Tijuana in Rosarita right on the coast. We are in a condo right next to a house which is the clinic. We are on the 5th floor with a gorgeous ocean view. It is whale migrating season, so we have seen a few whales passing by! And dolphins too!


After one full day of treatments, I was exhausted! Something to do every hour and lots of stuff into me: eating, drinking, shots (in the arm and rear:)), ivs, and enemas. There are 3 other patients here with their caregivers and it is always so cool to meet new friends. Actually, three of us are from Texas and all of us have colon cancer. Hmmm..... But seriously, I have met so many wonderful people in this whole thing that in many ways getting cancer has been a sweet blessing. Healing from cancer has been and will be an even greater blessing.:)








Here I am hooked to a nebulizer for a therapy I do twice a day. Emily said I look like Batman's nemesis, Bane.




This is in the house, or clinic. It's the kitchen where all the food and juices are prepared.

I was looking at just the titles of the General Conference talks by the 1st presidency and the 12 and most of them have something to do with conversion in one form or another, like discipleship, faith, etc. There is definitely a message coming in loud and clear!

Billy sounds like he's had a pretty rough life! I hope he embraces the gospel! I know he will be forever changed if he does!

The sister missionaries came over on Tuesday night after dinner. Dad was home teaching and Emily disappeared up to her room, so it was just me and them. I think it turned into a ward missionary correlation meeting. :) I was asking how the work was going and they said it was all dried up. So I got on a roll and was talking about some of the principles in The Power of Everyday Missionaries. And they were saying that they wanted to do a missionary fireside for the ward, but didn't get any support from the ward leadership. They were told no one would come. Well I got on another roll and was popping ideas about marketing the fireside by saying things in the bulletin and on a poster something like: WANT TO INCREASE THE SPIRIT IN YOUR HOME TO PROTECT YOUR CHILDREN? Come see how at the missionary fireside! And then I brainstormed that you invite all the ward missionaries to take a principle or chapter from The Power of Everyday Missionaries and condense it into a powerful, motivating

3 minute presentation. That would be the fireside. And then ask like 40 families to bring dessert. :) Then you would have at least 40 families plus the ward missionaries there. And the ward missionaries would be putting their noses in the book and learning too! I was on fire! That just warmed me up though.

Then I started in on Elder Perry's instructions for the ward mission plan of 15 less active or investigators from the High Priest Group, Elder's Quorum, and Relief Society. I asked how that was going and they said the 15 names haven't changed since last October! Then I got really fired up!!! I think Damon did such a great job teaching me the vision of it! He said if it is fluid and the organizations understood that they are responsible for the list, to go visit them and invite them to take the missionary discussions. If they say yes, then get the appointment set up, maybe inviting a member of their organization to come to to fellowship. If they say no, then take them OFF the list and put a new one on. It should be in constant flux. Then at the ward council or PEC, the reporting should be 5 minutes max. The less actives would be warmly loved and fellowshipped by the members who know how to do that really well. Then the less actives will bring a bunch of investigators with them, because that is their circle of friends. Doing this would keep the missionaries soooo busy teaching!

It is a BRILLIANT plan. (Obviously, because the Holy Ghost, a member of the Godhead inspired Elder Perry or President Monson or someone about it!!!) And I heard that Elder Perry said this plan would not change and go forward into the Millennium. Anyway, so I was frustrated that I wasn't in the ward council to pound the vision into these people! And then I realized that DAD is in the ward council!! So right then he came home from home teaching and I shared with him and he said he was on board to teaching this and trying to get it rolling in our ward. The sisters were pretty excited about my ideas and they can't wait till we get back!:) It was fun!

I can't believe how intense this therapy is! I wake up before 7 and at 7 or before I have a nurse come into my room and give me a liver shot in my BUM! It's a bummer. haha And then I get a cup of coffee. :) That goes in the other end too as an enema and I hold it for 10 min and that's not fun either. At 8 we go down for breakfast of oatmeal with soaked dried fruit and raisins in it with a little sweetener. No milk. And a fresh squeezed glass of orange juice. And an herbal tea of several things that help my liver get healthy and shrink my tumors. I also have about 10 supplements to take. At 9 I get a glass of green juice and a liquid vitamin that's nasty. At 9:30 a glass of carrot and green apple juice with more supplements. I put the nebulizor on and breathe in a treatment. I also have a bag or two of therapies going in my port. At 10 a carrot juice with supplements. Anyway, there are other shots, but not every day. I will be doing 5 enemas a day, taking 30 something pills, 13 glasses of juice 2 nebulizor treatments and three bland meals a day. It just goes and goes.

I hope all is well! I am so proud of you and so grateful for all you are doing!!! Your serving is giving me so much strength!!! I pray all the time that I will be blessed and our family will be

blessed through your service and I know we are!!! Keep smiling and expect miracles! Know that I am praying for you!

The day doctor came up and took my hand and I think felt so bad that he ordered the beautiful flower arrangement for me for my birthday that Dad took a picture of.:)

Hi Taylor!!!

I don't know what to say. Oh yes I do! So after talking with you I talked to Spencer. He is hanging out with a girl in the YSA ward and he posted a picture of him and her on FB. So Dad went on FB and clicked on her link. It went to her page and her banner picture is her with a few people and a few missionaries. And two of the missionaries are your ZL companions!! Her name is Sharlie Howe. This church is sooooo small! Everyone seems connected!

I love this quote by Orsen F. Whitney:

"No pain that we suffer, no trial that we experience is wasted. It ministers to our education, to the development of such qualities as patience, faith, fortitude and humility. All that we suffer and all that we endure, especially when we endure it patiently, builds up our characters, purifies our hearts, expands our souls, and makes us more tender and charitable, more worthy to be called the children of God . . . and it is through sorrow and suffering, toil and tribulation, that we gain the education that we come here to acquire and which will make us more like our Father and Mother in heaven."

But there is so much in life to be happy about and there is sorrow and suffering I haven't gone through that I probably won't go through, like never getting married, or not being able to have children, or a terrible divorce or stuff like that. I just take what is given to me and love it and feel gratitude for the Love of God that is manifest in my life in every way.

I am grateful to be here and for all the people who are taking care of me. Some of the patients here are getting a bit negative and that's too bad. When I first got here, the group of patients were more positive. I'm going to try to just be with Dad and Emily more.

I hope the work continues to explode in Maricopa! I am excited for May 24th for you and hope there are many baptisms on that great day!!! You are a great missionary. I'm sorry if I said anything to embarrass you in front of your companion. I didn't mean to. Your lively spirit energizes and motivates people and sometimes you get so into the moment you make memories for many people. That is a great quality of a leader and that is what I was trying to communicate by reminding you of some moments. It was to show how you can rally a group and get them excited. That is a unique gift that you have and something I LOVE about you!

You said you had something planned when you met your companions at the meeting, but then they threw the flag at you and wanted a picture. So that threw you off. What were you planning on doing? Just curious!

I love you Taylor! You mean so much to me. I can't imagine my life without you in it bringing with you such positive sunlight. You are totally welcome to share anything that may not be positive with me because then I would know to find ways to bolster you up. I'm so glad you are in a great companionship and are helping the many missionaries in your zone. And I'm glad you are having so much success in your area with people finding the truth and changing their lives for the better!

Hi Taylor!!!

I hope this email finds you happy and healthy! This week has been a long one for me! Each day is so similar to the one before and it's so long and there is so much I do that by the end of the day I am exhausted and feel like I accomplished a lot, even though I mostly sat around. This is the schedule:

7:00 - a nurse comes in and gives me a shot in my bum. I take 4 supplements with peppermint tea and do a coffee enema

8:00 - breakfast (oatmeal with raisins and a type of sugar, a 6 oz glass of fresh-squeezed orange juice, and about 8 supplements

9:00 - a green juice and a shot glass with a tablespoon of a nasty liquid vitamin. Also another enema.

9:30 - an apple/carrot juice and supplements

10:00 - an apple/carrot juice and supplements. A therapy using a nebulizer over my mouth

11:00 - a carrot juice and supplements. IV treatments

12:00 - a green juice and supplements

1:00 - lunch with a carrot/apple juice and supplements. Lunch is Hippocrates Soup, some form of potatoes, green salad, and an over cooked vegetable

2:00 - green juice with nasty liquid vitamin. Enema.

3:00 - carrot juice with supplements

4:00 - carrot juice with supplements

5:00 - apple/carrot juice with supplements. Enema.

6:00 - dinner with apple/carrot juice with supplements. Dinner is the same soup and a different form of potatoes and a green salad and different over cooked vegetables.

7:00 - green juice with nasty liquid vitamin. Nebulizer treatment.

By around 7:30 to 8 I am done with all of it and can relax, call Grandma Scott, and hang out with Dad and Emily. By 9:30-10 I am so tired! I don't know why, but I am. Two days a week I get a shot of a dead vaccine called Colies in my arm. That sometimes makes me get chills and then a fever. My arm hurts in that spot and is tender for about 3 days. I also once a week get my blood drawn and they separate the white blood cells from the red blood cells and give me back the red later that day. Then for 3 days they increase a certain kind of white blood cell called the dendritics. After the 3 days, they put it back in me through an IV. So between all of the therapies and the juices and enemas and the food that is sometimes hard to eat, my body is getting pounded. I thought I would give you a detailed description of the treatment so you can visualize me and what I'm doing each day.

We were able to have a little religious discussion with a couple of ladies from England who are here and a guy from Texas and his mother who are here. The guy is Catholic and very devout, along with his mother, but they stayed at the dinner table as the two ladies asked Dad and I questions about the Church. The patient, Kareen, from England is Jewish, but not active in her faith. And her friend isn't any religion, but tends to favor Buddist beliefs. We shared the First Vision and talked about prophets and apostles and The Book of Mormon, and talked about Grandma and Grandpa's conversion. I don't know how it affected them, but we did our best.

I have to lie on my bed for 12-15 minutes every time I do an enema, so I'm reading to pass the time. I have already read Divine Signatures (again. I have read it at least once before) It is so good! There is a chapter that is so applicable to you, I want to share it. I think I will print it when we get home and mail it to you. The gist is there was a mission president who decided to encourage his missionaries to not pass up hidden opportunities when an appointment falls

through or they get a no-show. When that happens, look around and follow the Spirit, because there will probably be someone else you are supposed to teach. He called them little miracles. And when the zone leaders called in to report each week, he would ask at the end if there were any little miracles they had had. They always had one. In the chapter he gives 4 examples. I'll send it to you! It's a really great message though!

Now I'm reading the Biography of Joseph Smith by his Mother. I've read it several times also, but I love how inspiring it is!!! So much adversity, so much faith and so many miracles! The gospel is true! The Lord's hand is in it and it is glorious in it's history, restoration, doctrine and impact on our lives. I love the gospel with all my heart and am so grateful that I was raised with it and have the knowledge that I have. I am so looking forward to teaching and preaching and serving missions with Dad! It is my great desire!

I love you so much Taylor!!!!! You are such a blessing in my life!!!! I know you are where you should be and doing what you are doing!!! It gives me such peace of mind! Keep being the wonderful person you are and bringing light and salvation to the people of Maricopa! You are part of the greatest work that is on the earth! Keep smiling and expect those miracles!!!!!

I got your email 24 hours after you sent it and these past two days at home have been soooo busy, I haven't been able to get to my email. On Friday I never even got out of my pajamas!:) I am so glad you found the letter! Every word we meant with all our hearts! You are loved by our family so much and we are continuing to pray for you! I look so forward to hearing of your progress and in hearing how your book is going, when you get working on it! But that may be a little while as you adjust back to life at home.

So when we got home it was late, but I made a mad dash to the Whole Foods store to grab what I could to get us going the next day. On Friday, we started unpacking boxes and putting things in their place and setting up the juicer and making coffee and I put too much water in the oatmeal, so that it was runny. And then when I made the soup, it was too thick and I made a TON! My friend came over and it was great to see her, but it threw the schedule off a bit. I think we got in about 8 or 9 juices and 1 enema, but I made all three meals! I was exhausted and had to lie down twice and just fell right to sleep.

Yesterday was much better! I got all the green juice stuff washed and divided up into ziploc bags and cut and washed all the carrots for the day too and put those in a big gallon-sized bag. Damon made breakfast and the oatmeal was too thick this time, but I just added water and it was fine. I did all the juices and 3 enemas and Damon gave me a Colly's (sp?) shot and I vacuumed the house. It was a good day and I had a lot of energy, but I couldn't and shouldn't keep this up!! Tomorrow we are having the people come over that are going to help and we will try to train them. It should be interesting, kind of like the blind leading the blind!:) But I am so grateful to have the help!!!

Ok, so I have made potatoes where I cube them up and instead of onions on the bottom, I have the lemon juice from one lemon. Then I shake a little dill on top. Then I cover and cook on low for about 20-30 min. and it isn't too bad! Kind of tangy! And instead of onions under the veggies, I have just sliced a tomato and added a tiny bit of water. And that is working out pretty good too. But it's hard and Damon and I are having some emotional pain with the food and knowing it's so long term. It's one thing to eat at the clinic, but it's a whole other thing to eat this way at home where we have memories of good food and it's going to be an adjustment. But we just need to find ways to enjoy life without food being so important! Right?

I hope you travel safe and it is a good flight with no problems!!! Give Phil our love!!! You are in our thoughts and prayers and I would love an update on how your travels went and how you are adjusting back, but only when you have a free moment, which may be a while and I totally understand!!!

Till then, keep smiling your beautiful smile and know that we are thinking of you and cheering you on here in Katy, Texas!!!

Hi Taylor!!

You are sounding so good and it sounds like you just keep meeting wonderful people who are finding joy as they learn about the gospel! That is the most fulfilling feeling in the world I think! And then to see people stop learning or reject the glad news is pretty discouraging. But you are just doing so well and keeping an energetic, positive attitude that is awesome to see! I got an email with a picture of you in the bib and it was funny and great!!:) I loved it! You are being well cared for by the members!!

What a week for me!! I read Dad's letter to you and he summed it up, but WOW! It was a tough week! I was crying, feeling pain in my gall bladder and then we get a group email from one of the people who had come to the clinic in Mexico. She said that the stomach pain her partner had after three days at the clinic still hadn't gone away and so they went to the ER in Canada and her tumor had grown and she just started blasting the clinic and therapy and it

was a devastating email. So then the next day my energy dropped, my anxiety went sky high and then I was queasy and not wanting to eat the food and I was having tons of gas and even got a fever. Dad was super stressed. That night we read in the Gerson therapy book about healing reactions and every one of the symptoms I had was listed and it was supposed to happen after about week five of being on this intense therapy. So we totally calmed down and realized that was what was going on and then felt so glad that I was responding correctly!:) the next day I felt much better and each day I'm doing better. The next healing reactions should be at 3 months (August), 6 months (November), and 9 months (February). Each successive one will be longer and worse, so we just need to expect it and it will be easier to deal with.

Grandma Scott is coming out tomorrow to visit for at least a week maybe more. I am sooooo happy!!! I can't wait to see her! She helps me feel better just by her being here!! And maybe she can help our helpers be better helpers too, like maybe coming up with recipes that I like.:) one of the helpers is not getting some of the things and we are having a difficult time communicating. Dad spent a lot of time on Saturday with her walking step by step through some of the stuff, and he's still not sure she understands. She damaged our \$2500 juicer, so we have to be careful juicing until Dad gets a part replaced. Oh the adventure just keeps getting more adventurous!!:)

We had a high councilor speak in church yesterday. He sounded a little like a southern baptist preacher. He's black and spoke about the two great commandments and love, and then talked about the best way to love is to do missionary work. He said, "If you haven't invited someone you know to participate in something in the last three months, then shame on you... shame on you... shame on you." It was totally silent and I know uncomfortable. The Katy First ward had joined us because something had blown over at their building. Then he said, "In all the years I've been a member, I have hardly EVER seen a black member. I know you know someone who is black. And you might think they wouldn't want to hear the message. Well, shame on you... shame on you... shame on you!" And half the time he was crying and whispering his words. A very different high council talk. I appreciated his passion, and I did feel a surge of motivation to get out and just start talking to people. But the delivery was probably inappropriate. I found out after church an investigator was there and the sisters didn't think it went over very well with her.

Anyway, I'm not meaning to be negative, just share some extra dramatic stories to make my letter interesting.:)

I've been reading the Old Testament like crazy! This past week I read 1st Samuel, 2nd Samuel, 1st Kings and 2nd Kings. Now I'm on 1st Chronicles ch 10. These books remind me of Ether where it just briefly mentions the king's name, if he was wicked or righteous and maybe a story. And then at the end, they are destroyed because they turned away from the Lord, who would have preserved them if they just kept His commandments. It is truly amazing to me His long suffering with their wickedness! And is amazing to me how fast people can

become wicked and completely lost. And truly what a glorious time it is right now! The Lord wanted to give the Israelites the blessings of the temple and priesthood, but they rejected it right from the start. But WE have all the blessings, and we have so many faithful and converted members who are keeping covenants all over the world! And like Nephi saw in vision in 1Ne 14:14, "And it came to pass that I, Nephi, beheld the power of the Lamb of God, that it descended upon the saints of the church of the Lamb, and upon the covenant people of the Lord, who were scattered upon all the face of the earth; and they were armed with righteousness and with the power of God in great glory."(italics mine)

Hi my sweet son!!!

I sent a package with a letter in it to you last week, but it may not have come yet. You may get it today and get two week old news after this letter. Sorry!:)YAY!! It's Monday and that means I get to hear from my boy!!!!! I love Mondays!!! I hope your week went well! You are teaching so many people! How do you manage your time between your missionary stuff and your leadership stuff? It probably keeps you super busy!! Like a super monkey! :D

This last week was a roller coaster ride! I think I had another healing reaction, as the Gerson therapy talks about. I had a sharp pain right in the center of my stomach a couple of times and the food was so hard to eat. Then I was anxious again and so tired and kind of depressed. And this was when Grandma Scott was here. I had good moments too, though. One night I had a slight fever. Saturday Grandma flew home and that day I felt so much better and Sunday I felt good too and had more energy. This therapy is a real adventure!! I guess as we go through the ups and downs we will come to recognize what's happening better. Poor Dad! He gets so worried when I'm low.

Yesterday I taught in Relief Society and I think the lesson went pretty good. I felt the Spirit as people shared and that was my desire, that the Holy Ghost would be present and testify to the women and they would be strengthened and edified. My lesson was based on the talk by Elder Corbridge called "The Prophet Joseph Smith." I love that talk!! I have read it several times and listened to it several times. And each time I get more out of it.

I started with the end because so many times we spend all our lesson on less important stuff and then run out of time before we get to the best part. And the best part was when he testifies of Joseph Smith and says we don't have many options as to how and why he did all that he did. Either he was a pretender or a prophet. And either he did it all alone, or had the help of Heaven. It's so simple and the evidence is so overwhelming that Heaven was involved in everything he did!! The other girl was really stressing us all out.

He says that when he's sent somewhere on an assignment, he knows there is at least one person he is specifically sent to help or bless. And while he's there he'll be reorganizing a stake presidency and having lots of meetings. But in his mind, that's not the most important reason he's there. I thought that was so interesting.

This past week was tough but I got through it. I had a day where I had a fever and was in bed. I had a massive anxiety attack another day. But they both passed and there was much rejoicing.:) Dad and Emily are the best support in the world! I am so grateful for them!!! Each night when dinner is over and all of my therapy is done for the day, Dad, Emily and I try to do something fun. This week some of the things we did were watch I Love Lucy episodes, go on an hour drive down Cinco Ranch Blvd and around new developments, talk, and Saturday night we watched the movie "Newsies," a musical that the song "Seize the Day" came from that you did in show choir those many years ago. Last night we watched a couple of Mormon Messages and had a good conversation.

Daniella Martin in our ward (she's Emily's age and plays the harp) has been having health problems for a year but the family has been pretty quiet about it. But yesterday Dad made an announcement at their request, telling a few details and asking for the ward to fast this Sunday for her. She has a tumor on her spine. They don't know if it is cancerous, but she will be having surgery on it in a week or two. Emily wants to do something for her, so I suggested we sew a little lap quilt for her. Aunt Rita made the cutest lap quilt for me and I love it so much! It gives me a lot of comfort. Here's a picture:

The other side is that super duper soft fuzzy material that is pink with white polka dots.

So I think we will go get the stuff today and Emily can sew it together. That should be a fun outing and project!

I'm now in the book of Psalms in my reading the Old Testament. I'm in the 50's. But yesterday I read psalms 41 and this is what I read:

- 1 Blessed is he that considereth the poor: the Lord will deliver him in time of trouble.
- 2 The Lord will preserve him, and keep him alive; and he shall be blessed upon the earth: and thou wilt not deliver him unto the will of his enemies.
- 3 The Lord will strengthen him upon the bed of languishing: thou wilt make all his bed in his sickness.

(The footnote for the word "make" says "IE heal all his infirmities when he is sick")

It gives me even more reassurance that Heavenly Father is mindful of me and my desire to continue serving in this life. Dad and I have considered the poor our whole lives by paying a fast offering each month. As we have been blessed with more income we have increased our fast offering. And this last year or two we have sought for further blessings for our family by paying a massive fast offering each month. The Lord has turned right around and blessed us beyond abundant and then when we needed resources for my healing, it was right there. So I take comfort in this scripture and know He keeps His word, and I can testify to it! When I read it yesterday it was like a reassurance and a blessing. He is so good!

I hope your week is a very special one and full of miracles and sweet memories!! I know you are in the Lord's service. It is the best kind of work there is in the whole universe!:) keep being the best you can be and shine your light and smile!!! I love you so very, very, very much!!!!! You are my precious boy!!!

Hello my boy!!!

As always I loved your letter! I'm glad everything I've sent arrived and worked out well! You sound so busy!! And happy, and I'm so glad!! How is your new companion and roommates? I assume you are still over the zone? Sister Riggs bore her testimony yesterday and said that Spencer, or Elder Riggs, was transferred and is now on a bike. She said, "and you that know him know that he is not small by any definition, and he is out all day on a bike in Arizona in 112 degree heat and telling me he is so happy and it's the bast life ever." :D I am so happy for him and I thought you'd like to hear that.

Auna and Ron had their second baby two days ago. A girl and her first name is Daisy. I don't have any other details yet, but I thought I'd pass on what I do know.

The treatment continues on. In two days I will have been doing this full time for ten weeks. I got a shot last night in my arm. I get those twice a week. But about a half hour afterwards I got massive chills for about twenty straight minutes, and then a really high fever for a half hour. It's a common reaction, but I haven't had such a strong one as that. But I think it was a good sign that my immune system is totally waking up and immediately recognized the foreign invader and got right to work eliminating it and hopefully did a lot on the tumors too! BURN BABY, BURN, BURN, BURN!!!:)

But I feel really good today and I'm so grateful!! In August I am expecting a really strong healing reaction and am a little nervous about it. But in the meanwhile I am grateful for good days. And last week was a pretty good week. For the Fourth of July, we went to the ward

breakfast for a half an hour and that was fun, just visiting with people. And in the afternoon Emily, Dad and I went to the park behind our house and ate snacks. (I ate organic cantaloupe and grapes) and we played a game. Then that night we went over by La Centera and parked in the junior high parking lot to watch fireworks. Can you believe it, it rained and thundered?!! And the temp dropped to 75 degrees! But the show went on! We left after 5 minutes because Dad didn't want to get stuck in traffic and have me breathing all the fumes.:) so we saw that Sprouts parking lot was empty and there was still a good view, so we watched the last five minutes of the show. It was a good day and felt a little like a holiday even though I still had to eat the same food. How was your 4th?I'm sure you got some great food! Did you do any teaching or finding or was it like Christmas?

I was so unintelligent yesterday! I took my purse along with my Sunday bag to church. Normally I put my wallet and key in the Sunday bag to save more stuff to carry. But I just grabbed my purse. Well, when I got to the church I didn't want to carry everything, so I left my purse in the car and didn't lock the doors because the key was in my purse and wouldn't let me lock it. I was a couple of minutes late, so I just ran in. When I came out 3 1/2 hours later, someone had gone through the car and my purse and had taken my wallet. Luckily they didn't take the car!! Dad told me later someone else had their window smashed and their purse taken. So I guess I am thankful I had the doors unlocked!:) lesson learned though! I'm so trusting and I guess I shouldn't be. Bummer!

We finished The Book of Mormon as a family again. Finally!! We started it back when Elder Bednar came and asked us to find all the "in the strength of the Lord" references. THAT took a while!! So instead of starting over, we decided we are going to go through Preach My Gospel and do the scripture study sections in each chapter and discuss the questions. So far it's been good! Our stake presidency has asked the stake to use Family Home Evening this summer to focus on Preach My Gospel, and they have outlined which chapter to study which week. We are a couple of weeks behind because we got the announcement late because of our trip to Mexico. But we are trying to follow their council. There is so much in each chapter that to do a lesson in FHE, it just highlights the main points. But each of us has taught at least one lesson and that's who gets the most out of it, right? It is good too to get an overview, and now doing the scripture study and questions for family scripture, we will get more into it.

The gospel is true, and the Savior leads and guides the church through President Monson. The work is rolling forward and you are part of it! I'm so grateful you are on the Lord's side and converted! These days are not for the summer soldier!! (Although when Thomas Paine wrote "The American Crisiis" I don't think he had ever been to either Arizona or Houston in the summer!!!:)) I am not sure if you know what I'm referring to, so in the spirit of the Fourth of July, I found a nice article that summarizes the history and the then I will give the famous document to you.

During the 1770's, as the American revolution developed, soldiers who joined the Continental Army during the spring or summer but went AWOL in the fall or winter were known as "summer soldiers".

Many of the "summer soldiers" were farmers who would join up with the Army when their crops were planted, fight during the summer, and then go back home in the fall to help with the harvest.

Others would stay with the Army through the harvest, but sneak off in the middle of the night once the weather got cold.

Meanwhile, the people who supported the revolutionaries when the revolution was going well -- but not otherwise -- were called "sunshine patriots".

So in the famous passage from "The Crisis" where Thomas Paine wrote:

The summer soldier and the sunshine patriot will, in this crisis, shrink from the service of their country

he was talking -- quite literally in the former case -- about the fair-weather friends of the Revolution.

The American Crisis is a collection of articles written by Thomas Paine during the American Revolutionary War. In 1776 Paine wrote Common Sense, an extremely popular and successful pamphlet arguing for Independence from England. The essays collected here constitute Paine's ongoing support for an independent and self-governing America through the many severe crises of the Revolutionary War. General Washington found the first essay so inspiring, he ordered that it be read to the troops at Valley Forge.

Here is just the first paragraph:

THESE are the times that try men's souls. The summer soldier and the sunshine patriot will, in this crisis, shrink from the service of their country; but he that stands by it now, deserves the love and thanks of man and woman. Tyranny, like hell, is not easily conquered; yet we have this consolation with us, that the harder the conflict, the more glorious the triumph. What we obtain too cheap, we esteem too lightly: it is dearness only that gives every thing its value. Heaven knows how to put a proper price upon its goods; and it would be strange indeed if so celestial an article as FREEDOM should not be highly rated. Britain, with an army to enforce her tyranny, has declared that she has a right (not only to TAX) but "to BIND us in ALL CASES WHATSOEVER" and if being bound in that manner, is not slavery, then is there not such a thing as slavery upon earth. Even the expression is impious; for so unlimited a power can belong only to God.

Ok, so there's a little patriotism for you! But the conflict we are in in these last days is very similar! As he says, "hell is not easily conquered. The adversary wants us to be HIS slaves and under his tyranny FOREVER! And these days and the ones ahead require more of us. More faith, more commitment, more obedience, more holiness, which will give us more power to overcome and prepare the world for the Savior's coming. And I love how his line "the harder the conflict, the more glorious the triumph. What we obtain too cheap, we esteem too lightly: it is dearness

only that gives every thing its value" goes right along with being converted and the price of enduring to the end and the price of discipleship.

So keep smiling and testifying and serving and loving and teaching and inviting and baptizing and strengthening! I love you so much I can hardly contain it! Usually when I think of you I am full to bursting and sometimes it comes out in tears how grateful I am for you! I thank Heavenly Father every day for you!!! Know that I'm praying for you and thinking of you and hoping for you to have wonderful, amazing experiences that draws you ever closer to Heavenly Father and His beloved Son, Jesus Christ, who you are an emissary of!

I hope all is well! You are always in my thoughts! I'm glad you are enjoying your companionship!! As you said, President Toone gives you great companions!! I think you decided before your mission though, that all of your companions were going to be awesome and that has affected how you see them! That can also make a difference!

Elder Wright's mom made friends with me on Facebook. She thinks you were comps with him and I'm not remembering. I went back through some of your letters and saw you went on exchanges with him and he had to go somewhere to get a brain freeze.:) she said she saw something you posted and saw that Victoria Craig liked it. They knew the Craig's well when the Craig's were in North Carolina. Small world, huh? She said Elder Wright and Logan were friends.

Emily was having a hard time working for us so Dad sent an email out through Susan Comb's email and asked if anyone was interested. We got a few responses, but the first was Lauren Riggs. But I am so spoiled in my life that I needed this to learn that life isn't about having fun or always being comfortable.:)

But even in spite of discomfort, I watched Napoleon Dynomite (my lips hurt real bad!) and a couple of other movies, went on a nice walk around the neighborhood with Dad, put a birthday package together with Emily for Damon, had a great writing group, went to Barbara Anderson's, listened to Denise Killingsworth talk about her struggles for two hours, talked on the phone with Amy, John, and Damon, shopped with Emily at Target for a Star Wars t-shirt for a sci-fi dance, and many other happy things this week. (Well, the phone call with Sister Killingsworth wasn't happy, but I was happy I was in a strong place that day to be able to help her)

I hope your week goes super and you can feel my love pouring all over you! You are amazing and I love you!! Keep smiling and loving! Miracles are an every day thing in missionary work because it is the Lord's work. And He is a God of miracles! I love you, I love you, and I'm cheering for you here in Katy, Texas!!! Yee ha!!!

I've had some healing reactions already where I have extra gas, chills, fever, queasiness, food aversion, tiredness, depression, anxiety, emotional. So those are some things to expect, only maybe for longer and stronger. Also they say that if you've had chemo, at the three month healing reaction, the chemo may start dumping into your system from your cells and you can have some of the same side effects as you had when you got chemo, which I didn't really have any, but who knows on this time.

So it's an adventure for sure! I hope all is well with you! I love you so very much!!!



7/21/14

Hi my precious son!!

How are you?!! You sound so good and I'm glad there is so much happening and you are doing wonderful things to bless investigators, missionaries and members!! You have a special way of doing that!!

Your training at zone conference sounded awesome! I loved the burning boat idea!! I am teaching Relief Society this week and it is supposed to be based on the General Conference talk "Your Four Minutes." This past week was good! Dad had an impression three times that Emily needed to go to Nauvoo which is this year's Stake Youth Conference. (Talk about a massive undertaking! It makes Moroni's Quest and Trek seem easy!) So he talked with her and on faith in Dad's prompting she decided to go. So this past week we've been getting ready by buying a few clothes and other things. She's been really anxious, but last night I talked with her and Dad had given her a blessing a few nights earlier and she woke up this morning at peace. I'm so grateful!! I really hope she has an amazing time! She leaves in a 1/2 hour!

I taught in Relief Society yesterday and I had read the talk my lesson was about called "Your Four Minutes" many times, and I had some ideas. This past week was pretty good. With Emily being gone it was quieter and I didn't have any visitors and Dad was distracted with work problems, so it was a little lonely, but it was all good, and now Emily is back, Grandma Scott is here and Damon comes tomorrow. So life is

Hi Heather!

Thanks for the update! I hope your training is going well! I totally see you decorating your desk right away!:) Sounds like a good job! I'm glad!

I've been going through a healing reaction, which is expected right now, at the 3 month mark. So I haven't been feeling the best, but I have some days that aren't so bad and some that I'm glad when they're done! It has been wonderful having Damon and Grandma Scott here. Grandma left today. This weekend was crazy! On Saturday was a Lifestyles company party at Dell's house. (He's the company president) They went all out!! They had a camera crew there taking video and pictures to do a promotional video, a restaurant that catered and brought a brick oven and they were cranking out personal pizzas, a trailer with video games in it, a blow up zip line, a human hamster ball, a mechanical bull, a bunch of arcade games, and their beautiful pool. We weren't really interested in all the activities, but everyone enjoyed the food. We were only there for about an hour and a half. I took an extra juice and a couple of apricots to eat. Then we came home and I rested and then we went to Stake Conference and I bore my testimony. Then we went home and Ethan and his new wife, Sarah, came over with Brandon to visit. They came to town to go on a cruise. Dad bought a big bag of boiled crawfish, so they sat around eating those and piling their plates high with the crawfish. It reminded me a little of Risky's Barbecue and all the bones piled high. So I was still full of energy at 10:00 that night and Dad was amazed, because I've mostly been hunkering down the last couple of weeks riding out this relatively easy healing reaction, wearing pjs all day, etc.

Then the next day I went to Stake Conference and felt great and afterwards talked to several people and then went home. We got back on schedule and Dad and I had a nice talk together, and then I started feeling some sharp gas pains that I had a few weeks ago during my last healing reaction. So for the next two hours, I just dealt with that. They subsided and I started eating dinner. I was about half done when the pains came back worse. I went to the couch and sat down with a pillow and blanket. I was breathing fast and closing my eyes and praying and just hurting. Everyone felt so helpless. Someone suggested a blessing and I always accept those! So Dad anointed and Damon started the blessing. In the middle, I realized I was going to throw up. So I blurted, "Mom, get a pan." Damon kept blessing and Grandma went to the kitchen as I tried not to throw up. She came back with a post it note pad and a pen. I said, "No, a pan." So Damon ended the prayer, Dad ran to the kitchen and grabbed something and got it under my mouth in time. Do you remember how we tease Dad about how he says pin and pen? Now we can add pan to the list!:) but he knew what I

was saying. Grandma thought I wanted her to write down what Damon was blessing me with.:) I think it's so funny!! My pains gradually calmed down over the next hour and I was able to sleep perfectly well. I may have a similar thing happen a couple more times, but I know they go away and it isn't scary because I'm almost positive it's part of the healing reaction. I think it may be some pretty toxic stuff that gets into my intestines and they are dealing with it. It could be some chemo dumping, so I just have to deal with it and it will go away eventually. But I seem to be responding well to the therapy. Everything the book is talking about, is what is going on with me, so I'm very hopeful I'm going to heal.

I haven't had any tumor marker tests or scans, and probably won't for a few more months. I've had a lot of radiation, so we want to be more conservative on how many I get. Plus I think if we get them too soon, we won't see as much progress as we will in a few months. The tests have had us on an emotional roller coaster ride, so we got off the ride for a while.

But I'm grateful for this therapy (or I WILL be grateful:)). It is such a refining experience. And there are many blessings I have. Just the fact that we have help with the therapy 12 hours a day and are able to afford it is HUGE! I feel privileged and almost guilty sometimes that I'm like treated like royalty. So as much as I complain and have pity parties, I know how blessed I am.

Luckily it is mostly gone now. And Saturday was just this awful depression over the whole house. But then, Sunday morning, everything seemed to lift and things are feeling a lot better now. Hello Sweet Boy!! (Taylor)

I'm so glad you got to go to the training with Elder Robbins! It sounds like you learned a lot! I'm glad you are back in the same apartment as Elder Diaz too! The other day, he made friends with me on Facebook and so did his mother. She messaged me and I am so slow at responding! I'm planning on it today though.:)

So last week at church I forgot to mention that it was Corbin Short and another priest named Jared Hannah's farewell talks. Corbin gave a long, but very thought-out and beautiful talk which I thought summed up the Preach My Gospel book perfectly. He mostly talked about obedience and faith and I thought maybe he had just referenced everything from Preach My Gospel, but he said, "you might be thinking I just took this right from a book or something, but I didn't. I have thought about this a lot and have studied and these are the things I have learned. He is prepared spiritually and I was very impressed! Jared did a great job too, but I don't think you know him, as he moved in after you left. This week it was Ben Monk's farewell. He also did a great job. It's pretty crazy! Corbin, if you didn't know is going to England. And Ben is going to Bangalor, India. Yikes! That was originally where Grandma and Grandpa Janis were called to serve. Then they were reassigned to Mongolia a few weeks later. Mason Allen was called to a southern California mission near LA, Spanish speaking. He leaves in October I think. So we are all thinking about missionary stuff a lot!

When I wrote you last Monday, I was still feeling pretty good from the weekend, but I wore myself out or something because then I got really tired that afternoon. On Tuesday night I was feeling a little better, so I went ahead with my Collies vaccine shot that I get twice a week in my arm. It can give me the chills after about an hour that usually last about 20 min, and then I get a fever and I'm fine the next day. But this one was a DOOZY!!! I got the chills and they were so strong and lasted 35 minutes. By the end I had a headache. Towards the end Dad asked if he could do anything. I asked for peppermint tea, which was on my nightstand. He put it to my lips and I took a tiny sip. 5 seconds later, I needed to throw up. Dad ran out to get a bowl. He came back and I mostly dry heaved as I continued to shake and my teeth chattered uncontrollably. Anyway, I finally calmed down and then I got a fever. I went to sleep and woke up at 2:30 and checked my temperature. It was 102. Well, the next day, instead of

feeling better, I continued the high temperature and felt very nauseated. It lasted 2 full days and I was in bed feeling very weak and sick, hardly eating. It was awful!

Then when that went away, the next afternoon right under my left rib cage, I felt what was probably part of my small intestine spasm. It was this sharp pain and it was like something went to twist and lurch and sent a pain like a side ache when you are running. I couldn't lie down in a comfortable position, so I sat up mostly. I didn't tell Dad, because he would have stressed out. So he went to sleep that night, not knowing about this. I just figure it in to all the parts of my body are healing at one time or another, and this will come and go. But by 11:30 that night, I had to sit up to not feel the pain. And Dad woke up and then I had to tell him and he stressed out. Oh well. So the next day it was still pretty sharp and steady. But gradually it has almost gone away.

On Saturday there was such a bad, gloomy, depressed spirit resting on all of us. But Sunday came and I felt as good as I did last Sunday, and we are trying to pull out of the craziness of last week. Today marks 4 months since I started the Gerson Therapy. I haven't cheated on eating once (except the sacrament bread and water.) It's been the longest four months of my life. But like every day on this therapy I feel like I climbed a mountain just to remind myself I get to climb it again the next day, I feel the same about each month too. And four months is a pretty decent chunk that is behind me.

Sorry to give such nitty gritty details. We did watch a couple of cute movies this week that brightened the mood. And I had a couple of visits from ladies and I talked to several family members on the phone, so not everything was bad. I think it was just one of the hardest weeks we've had. So this week should be good! I am grateful to call upon Heavenly Father anytime, anywhere. I'm grateful for His word. I found another promise of health and healing for those who help the poor (and it seems to indicate fast offerings in a way) in Isaiah chapter 58:6-11:

" 6 *Is* not this the fast that I have chosen? to loose the bands of wickedness, to undo the heavy burdens, and to let the oppressed go free, and that ye break every yoke?

7 *Is it* not to deal thy bread to the hungry, and that thou bring the poor that are cast out to thy house? when thou seest the naked, that thou cover him; and that thou hide not thyself from thine own flesh?

8 ¶Then shall thy light break forth as the morning, and thine health shall spring forth speedily: and thy righteousness shall go before thee; the glory of the LORD shall be thy rearward.

9 Then shalt thou call, and the LORD shall answer; thou shalt cry, and he shall say, Here I *am*. If thou take away from the midst of thee the yoke, the putting forth of the finger, and speaking vanity;

I teach the 4th Sunday in Relief Society from the Conference talks. It's been a wonderful experience to study the talks in depth! I've been blessed to feel good enough through all of this to go to church each Sunday. I'm so grateful!

Actually, I don't have a book club, but I do have a writing group. It has been really great! We get together at my home so that I can get all my juices. We are writing a life history of sorts. The lady in charge has a book called Legacy, and she will read a prompt or question and I set the timer for 15 minutes and we all write on that topic and then when the timer goes off, we go around and read to each other what we wrote. Then we do it again and sometimes a third time if we are up to it. It is great getting to know the women and it's nice to be writing down fun memories that just pop into my head. It's not complete, but it's something!

I know everyone wants to ease this burden for me and there are so many people who do in their own way. But mostly I just have to go through it. Dear, wonderful Elder Janis!!!!!

How are you my boy?!!! Your letter was awesome as usual! The mission training by Elder Schwitzer sounds like it was really good!! And Sister Toone's testimony touched me as you shared her story. You are such a wonderful son, I just pray that you will learn what Heavenly Father knows you need to learn. I am so thrilled with who you are and what I see you becoming! I think the story of her prayers for that one son was just that: she prayed that for

HIM, and probably not that for any of her other missionary children. I think I would have more specifics for Spencer, if you know what I mean.:)

How is it going with your two companions? I hope the newest one is able to stay! It's a hard road either way, but going home is much harder and seems to lead to thorny paths and a lot of sorrow, and not just for him.

That guy that takes 2 second videos of each day, WOW! What a great idea!! I love it! That would only make a 12 minute video of the year, so you could totally get like 10 seconds a day and it would be an hour. Add music and that would be too fun! Anyway, I might think about that!

Last week was better than the week before. And this weekend was good too. I hesitate to say I'm coming out of the healing reaction because I feel like I keep saying that and then still keep having reactions. But I do think I am feeling better and my energy is picking up slowly too. It's so much easier to have a positive outlook and feel gratitude when I feel good physically and mentally. It has been amazing to me how the healing reactions and the toxins that dump into my system affect my emotions too. Because they are circulating in my brain too, which can cause anxiety and depression. I have more compassion for people suffering from either or both of those. It is like night and day. When you have depression, it's like night and darkness and despair and when you don't have it, there is sunshine in the soul and a song in the heart, and HOPE smiling brightly before you. I ache to give that light to people. It is truly as debilitating as physical sickness and I've experienced both this last month. But there is light in my heart again, so I do think the next couple of months may be pretty good.

This week I read a devotional talk that Elder Holland gave at BYU a few years ago called Cast Not Away Therefore Your Confidence. He talks about receiving revelation and how Satan will try to thwart it either before (like with Joseph Smith before the First Vision) or after (as with Moses after his vision). He then talks about Moses parting the Red Sea and the lessons on revelation he sees from that story, and it really struck me how I've experienced that over and over this past year. He talks about 3 principles. The first is that revelation almost always comes in response to a question, an urgent question regarding some specific information. So like Moses at the Red Sea, with the Egyptian army coming upon them, he had an urgent question that was life or death: what do I do? Well, for me, my urgent question was where do I go for treatment, what will help me heal? If we exert all our powers to call upon God, there is not much Satan can do to stop the light from coming to us. And we got a very clear answer about Envita, and then a few months later about the clinic in Mexico and the Gerson Therapy.

The second lesson from Elder Holland was that in the process of revelation and in making important decisions, fear almost always plays a destructive, sometimes paralyzing role. That's what happened to the children of Israel. When they saw the army they freaked out and doubted. They forgot the miracles that had gotten them to where they were, the frogs, the lice, the deaths of the firstborn. He says that at those times of doubt, we must resist the temptation

to pain and to give up. That is Satan's greatest weapon against us. Then he quotes Moses: "And Moses said unto the people, Fear ye not, stand still, and see the salvation of the Lord... The Lord shall fight for you." And when I read that it hit me hard. My healing reactions were scary. I had to push thoughts of "is this working, am I really having a healing reaction, or is the cancer getting worse?" out of my head. And when we were in Arizona and we had paid so much money and the results hadn't started appearing, that was scary too. So Elder Holland says that the second lesson of revelation from this story is to go forward, don't doubt the revelation you received, the light that came from above.

And the third lesson is that "along with the illuminating revelation that points us toward a righteous purpose or duty, God will also provide the means and power to achieve that purpose." And that really got me! Of course for the Israelites, the Red Sea parted and they walked on dry ground and the army was swallowed up. The Lord provided. As I thought about my situation, I saw His hand in so many ways! He provided us with the means to do all that we have done this year. There is no way at any other time in our whole married life we could have afforded all this care. We lived from paycheck to paycheck. But what we have needed in the way of money has been there for us. Secondly, finding Envita was also a miracle. Aunt Heather had sent Dad an article about Envita and Dad didn't really get what they did, so he filed it away in the reject file. He got two more promptings to look at it again. On that third time, he finally got it and he called and we ended up going there and they made great progress in stopping the growth and shrinking the tumors. Third, before I even knew I was sick, Dad felt an urgency to have me get a passport. He made all the arrangements and took me where I needed to go to get it. Then he felt the same about Emily. After I came back to Arizona after my break in March, my tumor marker, as you remember, went up. The next week it went up again, and then I went back home for a week and that's when we decided that we should do Gerson. Well, we were going to wait till the end of May to go so that we could go to Ethan's wedding. But when we came back to Arizona, the marker was even higher. So we went the next week. We could not have gone that last minute without our passports. The Lord provided. And fourth, the helper that we had let go had actually partially broken our juicer. It is a Norwalk juicer, the top of the line juicer (\$2500). You can't get it at Bed Bath and Beyond, let's just say. You have to order it. But it was still functioning. Well, at the end of June, we had a 5th Sunday priesthood/Relief Society meeting on hurricane preparedness. Dad realized we were an emergency case if there was a hurricane. We have a generator, but the real problem is if the trucks aren't able to ship fresh organic produce in for a few days or weeks. So we realized we needed to have a plan to get out and fly to California. We would need to bring the juicer. If I get done before you are on I'll send an update. Otherwise I'll send you a Facebook message.

My pain is easing up, which is nice! Also we are gathering some good info on more things to do to tweak this system that may be very effective! I feel a lot of hope today. Also we talked with my dr in AZ today and I mentioned that it seemed like in Arizona on a scan I had a pretty big tumor and he looked it up. In January I had a PET scan and the biggest tumor was measured at 9.4 cm, which may mean that since January that tumor has shrunk a bit. And that changes the whole story. So that was very hopeful! We are going to follow up and send the two scans to Arizona and they will send them to the radiologist and ask for a tumor by tumor comparison in size and number. The reports have been so sketchy that it's been hard to know really what's going on. So it still may not be great news but there is definitely more hope. Also the dr didn't seem to think the cancer has spread to the ovaries. Not sure why but he said he wasn't concerned. So we have lighter hearts today. He gave me a few ideas about treating my liver with some extra TLC and is sending some stuff too. We have at least 3 other doctors in Mexico, and other parts of the country sending their ideas and trying their best to help as well.

I thought you would want to know. Sorry it took so long to get this off today! Sleep sweeter tonight please!! I love you and thank you both for reaching out to your friends in my behalf!!! I know it's helping me!!!

Hi Elder Janis!!!

Congratulations on being with Elder Jolley again!!!!! What a sweet blessing for you! I am so interested in how your one on one with President Toone went!!! Thank you for your Facebook post about asking for prayers! There have been so many people that have reached out and it's been so nice! The picture at prom really got Dad emotionally. I love that picture! I'm glad we thought to take it!

We feel the strength from all the prayers of the Tempe Arizona Mission. The day after, we started looking up this enzyme I've been taking orally. The doctor in Mexico sent an article to Dad a few days before of a lady who shrunk her tumors in DAYS taking the enzymes, but crushing them into a powder and basically doing an enema. So I've done three, but they are more uncomfortable than the coffee enemas, so we are still figuring it out, but the research we've done has a lot of good evidence that this enzyme is what the pancreas produces to kill any tumors the body may have. But if your pancreas stops functioning as well, cancer can grow. It's just like diabetes. When the pancreas gets damaged, it stops producing insulin and the body reacts with diabetes. So if you give it proper nutrition and insulin, you can live a good life. Anyway, we are feeling good about this and are still looking for more direction from Heavenly Father. We know He will lead us.

I've realized trust is an even higher form of faith. With faith we believe in things hoped for but not seen, but trust is having faith in the Lord and in his plan for you, believing He knows best and accepting His will without reservation. I have faith in things I hope for, but my trust runneth a little shallow.:) But each time I pray, I just feel like His will is for me to live, so I keep working hard!

It was so wonderful to talk to you and hear your voice!! You sound so good! I hope you aren't putting up too big of a strong and positive front for my sake that you are not sharing things that we could support *you* with. I sensed that in your Facebook status.

I am feeling much better these past few days since the mission started praying for me. Grandma Scott came in on Saturday, and had a layover in Phoenix and got the thunderstorm that delayed her getting to Houston by 7 hours. I'm sure you were getting hit pretty hard too! You got a car just in time!:) It is sooooo good to have her here!

We have had some undependable times with Lauren Riggs and Dad felt like we needed to let her go. So for now, Spencer is taking her place. It's a good job for him and it's nice just having family in the house at times!

Hi Heather!

I'm so sorry I haven't written in a while! I think it's because my nails are so crazy long and it drives me crazy to type. Hold on one minute while I go clip them!!...Ahhhh! Oh this is wonderful!!!!:) I don't know, it's not that big of a deal, but most everything seems to be an effort. Doing all the therapy and brushing my teeth and going to the bathroom is mandatory, and then if I can get in a shower and brush my hair, I'm having a really productive day!:) It's not that bad really.

So every day has its ups and downs, good things and bad. This past week and even most of last week has been really good. We had a phone consult about three weeks ago with a chiropractor who is a leader in a chiropractic program called Maximized Living. A chiropractor that Dad and Emily and now Spencer and I are going to is part of it and that's how we heard about him. Two years ago he was diagnosed with multiple myeloma (an incurable cancer in the bone marrow) and had a tumor in his brain. He did a lot of similar stuff as me and is now completely clear. So that's encouraging! Anyway, he studied all the stuff I have been doing and have done over the past year that Dad had sent over to him, and he said I should be totally clear of cancer, so since I'm not, we just need to find the missing key. Since my weight and energy had dropped he felt like I should tweak the Gerson Therapy just a little to drop a few juices and add in a couple of protein shakes with coconut milk and a few almonds. And to have meat a few times a week. (I had just gotten permission from the doctor in Mexico to have fish once a week.) He also wants me to get tested for food sensitivities that could be causing inflammation, since I eat the same things every day. That may be what is causing the pain I've been feeling. He also strongly recommended chiropractic adjustments. It was cool. When I went in to the chiropractor here, he has a machine that goes down your spine and it uses some kind of thermo something to tell where blockages are. So my top three vertebrae were compressed, which meant the nerves that run through them can't send or receive signals there, which is the brain stem. That is where communication to the whole body takes

place. Another place on my back had several vertebrae compressed which is the place in the spine where the nerves communicating to all organs in the abdomen are. So now that I have been a few times, my energy is up and my body is probably communicating a lot better. My weight still hasn't gone up, but we're working on it. Anyway, there were a few other suppliments and tests he recommended, but I really appreciated his positive attitude.

I wrote something to Taylor a few weeks ago I want to share. I may put it up on the Happy Corner page sometime, but I want to share it with you. I said:

"This week I read a devotional talk that Elder Holland gave at BYU a few years ago called Cast Not Away Therefore Your Confidence. He talks about receiving revelation and how Satan will try to thwart it either before (like with Joseph Smith before the First Vision) or after (as with Moses after his vision). He then talks about Moses parting the Red Sea and the lessons on revelation he sees from that story, and it really struck me how I've experienced that over and over this past year. He talks about 3 principles. The first is that revelation almost always comes in response to a question, an urgent question regarding some specific information. So like Moses at the Red Sea, with the Egyptian army coming upon them, he had an urgent question that was life or death: what do I do? Well, for me, my urgent question was where do I go for treatment, what will help me heal? If we exert all our powers to call upon God, there is not much Satan can do to stop the light from coming to us. And we got a very clear answer about Envita, and then a few months later about the clinic in Mexico and the Gerson Therapy.

The second lesson from Elder Holland was that in the process of revelation and in making important decisions, fear almost always plays a destructive, sometimes paralyzing role. That's what happened to the children of Israel. When they saw the army they freaked out and doubted. They forgot the miracles that had gotten them to where they were, the frogs, the lice, the deaths of the firstborn. He says that at those times of doubt, we must resist the temptation to pain and to give up. That is Satan's greatest weapon against us. Then he quotes Moses: "And Moses said unto the people, Fear ye not, stand still, and see the salvation of the Lord... The Lord shall fight for you." And when I read that it hit me hard. My healing reactions were scary. I had to push thoughts of "is this working, am I really having a healing reaction, or is the cancer getting worse?" out of my head. And when we were in Arizona and we had paid so much money and the results hadn't started appearing, that was scary too. So Elder Holland says that the second lesson of revelation from this story is to go forward, don't doubt the revelation you received, the light that came from above.

And the third lesson is that "along with the illuminating revelation that points us toward a righteous purpose or duty, God will also provide the means and power to achieve that purpose." And that really got me! Of course for the Israelites, the Red Sea parted and they walked on dry ground and the army was swallowed up. The Lord provided. As I thought about my situation, I saw His hand in so many ways! He provided us with the means to do all that we have done this year. There is no way at any other time in our whole married life we could have afforded all this care. We lived from paycheck to paycheck. But what we have needed in the way of money has been there for us. Secondly, finding Envita was also a miracle. Aunt Heather had sent Dad an article about Envita and Dad didn't really get what they did, so he filed it away in the reject file. He got two more promptings to look at it again. Hello my wonderful son!

How are you?? I love you so much!!! The weather in Arizona is looking like it's perfect! That is sooooo wonderful you were able to see Matteo and that he is still strong in the gospel!!! That reminds me of the sons of Mosiah and Alma when they met back up again. I'm sure from their background, they may have wondered if the other would have slipped back to their old ways too, and the joy of seeing each other and that they still were converted caused that overwhelming joy. Did you fall to the earth because your joy was so great even that you were full; yea, you were swallowed up in the joy of your God, even to the exhausting of your strength?:)

Taylor, I don't know if there has EVER been the opportunity for a missionary at any other time in the history of the world where on your mission you get to participate in the open house and dedication of TWO temples!!! This is super historic!!! What a huge blessing for you and for the people in Arizona!

I'm doing well. I have my ups and downs every day. It seems like I'm laughing and feeling great one hour and the next I'm crying and having a meltdown the next. I feel so impatient to be healed and Dad continues tirelessly to keep researching and sorting through so much information! It has been amazing what we have come across even in just the last week! He will most likely be in the hospital for the next 5 months, and Auna can't leave him there alone, yet it would be really hard to take care of a baby in the hospital too. Ron would have to quit medical school to be there, and that isn't a good option. So Mindy will be there maybe for the first 5 months, maybe traveling back to Richmond every few weekends or so. But it seemed like they couldn't quite get the idea of being grateful IN our circumstances. I said, "Ladies, he's asking us to go to a whole new level of gratitude! How do we do this?" Then I mentioned three of the stories he talked about, Nephi being strapped to the boat, Job, and Joseph Smith in Liberty Jail and each of them having something positive to say or glorying in the Lord in their trial.

I then had someone read this quote from his talk, which a couple of months ago Dad had studied four or five times and this is what he realized is the core of the talk:

"In any circumstance, our sense of gratitude is nourished by the many and sacred truths we *do* know: that our Father has given His children the great plan of happiness; that through the Atonement of His Son, Jesus Christ, we can live forever with our loved ones; that in the end, we will have glorious, perfect, and immortal bodies, unburdened by sickness or disability; and that our tears of sadness and loss will be replaced with an abundance of happiness and joy, "good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over."

While she was reading, I wrote on the board: Plan Atonement Resurrection

I expounded a little on that and then asked if anyone had relied on these "sacred truths" to help them get through a difficult time. There were a few. Then I put up about 9 blessings that President Uchdorf had given throughout his talk for developing this disposition:

- -Takes away the bitterness that may come into our lives
- -Makes life sweeter, more joyful, even glorious
- -Healing, peace and understanding
- -True joy and great happiness
- -Gentle peace in the midst of tribulation
- -Experience the closeness and warmth of heaven's embrace
- -Heals the heart and expands the mind
- -Broadens our perception and clears our vision
- -Inspires humility and fosters empathy toward our fellowmen and all of God's creation

In the comments that followed, Jen Hansen said something about how our trials we can see as blessings to be grateful for. I thought, "they aren't getting the point." So I tried to explain and then I just came alive with the Spirit and I was able to communicate and even learned as I was speaking, but I said something like, it's not the trial. It's all about the Plan, the Atonement, and the Resurrection that we can give thanks to the Lord every day, in good times and bad.

Nephi could glory in the Lord because of his understanding and gratitude for his knowledge of those sacred truths; it had nothing to do with the boat. And THAT is the most awesome thing! The Plan, the Atonement, and the Resurrection are SO glorious, so amazing, so grand and eternal and infinite, they trump every circumstance we may be going through. They will make things right, and our ultimate happiness is the whole reason they exist. So no matter the circumstance, we can give the Lord thanks as he asks and have the blessings that come as we develop this disposition. And I think the way we develop this disposition is to study and understand and ponder and truly FEEL appreciation for those three gospel truths. We can't study it enough. Anyway, that's what I learned and as I said most of that, I literally felt a light bulb turn on in everyone's mind. It was like a community aha moment. It was pretty awesome.

Well, I've taken a lot of your precious email time, so I will sign off. I know you are studying those three sacred truths daily and teaching it and your understanding and gratitude for them is magnified and increased because of it, and as you see people you are teaching go through trials, you have that knowledge burning in your heart and can give messages of hope and peace to them.

I love you so much!!! I hope you have a powerful and amazing week! I'm sure you will! You are a beacon of light shining in a world of dark chaos and there are many who will be attracted to that light. Keep shining, keep smiling and know that I am praying for you and loving you and thinking of you every day!!!

The open house went really well! Lots of people came it was a steady stream. Audralyn Allen had it decorated super nice and I was so grateful to her!! I think they raked in a lot of target gift cards and money!

My energy has been so low. I got a blood test done today so we'll see if my red blood cells are low and I need a transfusion. That would give me a lot of jump start energy.

Everyone is gone now. It was good to see them all. And you too!

I don't have any real spiritual thought to add to my letter today. I wanted to get this out before you sent and I don't know if I'm going to make it. I hope you get this today! I love you so so much and am cheering you on and praying for you!

I want to tell you about my lesson last week. It was about spiritual whirlwinds. We talked about what comes to mind when we think about spiritual whirlwinds. Elder Anderson said they are things in our lives that can uproot us from our faith. And just like the tree needs strong roots to stay up in the wind, we have things that help us stay strong and anchored to the Gospel.

I told about four different ways that they can be uprooted. One is through sin. But repentance is a powerful force to combat that. That is something we have control over. The other two were choices that other people make and also the things that happen because we are in a mortal state. And the last one he talked about later on was if our prophet says something that's contrary to your social or political beliefs that can be a test of faith and can be a spiritual whirlwind too.

Then I started the discussion by asking how do we prepare for spiritual whirlwinds. Sue Brown said you have to decide now where you stand no matter what, just like we tell the youth to decide now not to smoke etc. She was in an ambulance with her youngest son at one time and he was practically dead. It is to be opened when you get it and used! A second package in envelope in envelope form is going out today, and a third should appear a little before Christmas. Yay!!! So much to celebrate!!! So much to do!! I LOVE IT!!!

It sounds like you had a good week! You are on fire! It also sounds like you are meeting some very interesting people, and have lots of fun stories to tell. Everyone I talk to says they love reading your letters, you throw in such good stories!

This week has been crazy wonderful!!! It has been full of joy, magic, fun, tender mercies, discoveries of past tender mercies, just a beautiful, joyful season to be alive!

Shelby and Grandma have been here and have been my hands and feet and making so many things happen! I've got four goals or projects that I'm working on I'm so excited about and one of them was your package. I'm so grateful for them and the timing of them coming out this week!!

One of my projects is I am recording books for my grandchildren on video and audio. The video is for a few holiday books like T'was the Night Before Christmas and The Polar Express. Now I am audio taping my voice reading picture books that I love and I know you children enjoyed as well. I want to send the book with the audio to each grandchild to start their libraries so they can sit in bed at night and open the book and listen to grandma made to them. I have recorded two books per year for the first five years already. Dad has created a website for me called Tiffany Janis.com, and he is putting up the audio and videos. The videos aren't complete, Shalayne is going to edit them and behind me, (I'll be in a bubble reading the book), and the picture of what I'm reading will be the background. Dad has already bought almost all the books for all the grandchildren. :-) It was a very big order but presents for our grandchildren are mostly paid for the first 10 years of their life! How awesome is that!! I have portraits of myself through my childhood that grandma has and gave to me in an album, and I want to take them and make wallet size copies and put them in the front cover of the book to show what I looked like when I was their age. I'm so excited about this! I've been wanting to do this for a long long time. And so I thought it would be good to do now just in case, but I can enjoy sending them through the years as well but I will have it all done!!

Another project or goal that I've had is to finish my Personal Progress. Shelby is in the stake young women presidency and knows the program online, and is helping me go through and we're knocking it out. I have been flooded with love this last week. I am getting texts, phone calls, and requests for visits daily. I think the ward is bringing in dinners three times a week now. She and the doctor she works with are helping me to manage pain nausea and sleeping as well. The Lord is my main physician right now. feel that he has guided us, and provided everything we have needed to get me to this place, but he has not removed the cancer and so it's in his hands. My body is telling me I can't do very much of the therapy right now, so I am trying to live every day celebrating and eating happy things and thinking about goals and projects that I can do that keep me going and excited. I feel that my situation is like Gideon's in the Old Testament. The Lord reduced his army from 10,000 down to 300 to prove to everyone that there's no way except God who delivered them. I've done alternative therapies, I've done traditional therapies, and now I'm just putting my life in the Lords hands. He is the final decision maker. If it's my time to go it's my time to go. If not he will put flesh on my bones and heal me so that I can continue to fulfill my mission on earth. I feel very peaceful about this and it's giving me the freedom to just enjoy every moment and feel love. I think that love is the most important thing in the world and that's what were here to do: to learn how to love and I'm enjoying that so much!

So for the wedding, dad has chartered a private jet,... Yes, a private jet!!:) we will leave early in the morning, arrive 3 miles from the temple at a small airport, Roark will pick us up, and drive us to the temple. Ww will have the sealing and then have a little break, go to the luncheon, and then fly back home that night. It will be an exhausting day, but a wonderful day! Every Mothers' Day Eve, write a note to my children and put a rose in a vase near their bed. Tiffany talked so much about each of her beloved children. I felt as though I knew each of them!

Tiffany talked quite a bit about what she was planning to say to her nieces and nephews when she went to Utah for the wedding. She talked about the importance of covenants in providing protection, power and knowledge. After watching the video of that special time she spent with them, that is exactly what she taught.

We talked about some of our favorite books we had in common: The Infinite Atonement, The Hidden Christ (look at Proverbs), and In Times of Trouble by Elder Holland. Be still and know that I am God.

Tiffany really wanted to write in a journal for Damon before she died. She even sent Spencer out to buy one. She wanted it to be full of her telling him everything wonderful he has done.

She was worried that her handwriting would be too bad now, so we talked about some ideas how she could accomplish this.

Care packages for children's and women's shelter. Children's hospital gifts.

Tiffany told me about two books she had recently read: The Emotion Code and The Body Code.

The last thing we talked about was that she wanted me to find and read a talk on Healing Through Christ from BYU Women's Conference.

[This was the last email Tiffany sent. She had sent Spencer this mother's day email a couple years earlier. She sent it to me on Christmas Eve and asked if I would print it so she could give it to Spencer on Christmas Day.]

Happy Mother's Day! It is a wonderful day because I can celebrate the glorious fact that YOU are in my life and my son. I am so grateful to be your mother! And I am so proud of you!

This has been a really amazing year for you! You have grown in so many ways! First off, you have grown physically!:) You are a BIGGER boy this Mother's Day than last Mother's Day! But seriously, I know you have had goals and have worked incredibly hard to achieve them!!! Even though it drove me crazy (:D) I am totally impressed with your tenacity and drive.

You have also grown academically, learning so much and applying yourself to full-time university studies. And you got A's and B's!!! And all that plus playing football and reffing football. Yea for you!!!!!!! And even coming home you learned all about electrical systems and how to get a home ready and rented. You have so much ability in all of those areas, Dad has so much confidence in you.

You've grown in leadership abilities, through being first assistant in the priest's quorum and then volunteering to lead in Biddulph Hall. You helped organize the scripture study and prayer group and also temple trips. I'm so impressed.

You have grown spiritually too. I could feel it as you came home last semester in your relationships with Taylor and Emily, plus the fact that you continued to (try to) have the scripture group with Brandon when you got home. You are preparing for your mission in all these ways: physically, mentally, spiritually.

You are such a wonderful son! I wish I had a rose for you this morning sitting by your bed. I haven't figured out how to do that, but maybe someday I will! I love you so much, you are so precious to me!
